- 3. School Business
  - a. COVID-19 update
    - Although there has been little to no covid cases after Christmas Break, over half of cases once you came from an 8th grade party. The school board felt that pushing us to online learning was best because there was only 2 days of online school. Hoping the trend continues to go down going forward. Everyone is tired of masks and distancing but need to stay strong and keep up guard. Unless it's a mask off exposure students don't have to quarantine based on the new guidelines. If there was at least 10-15 min without a mask, a student is required to do a 7 day quarantine and need a negative test or quarantine 10 days. Virtual learning makes parents nervous but after during this school year with just over 100 positive cases, 2-3 were actually transmitted at school. All other cases were outside of school exposure. Kids are very safe at school, wearing masks and cleaning often.

#### b. Budget-YTD expenditures

- Land Trust
  - Summarized numbers for last year with 5 goals, professional development, academic support, student enrichment, school climate and technology. All funds used from this fund fall into one of these categories. Must tie back to an academic outcome besides school climate. Columns broken down by quarter. (Budget attached below) \$10k order out for technology, hasn't arrived yet. HP has a 6 months wait time for chrome books, 250 on their way.
  - Conferences have been cut down because of Covid.
  - After school programs will start this semester, the District approved them to move forward. Looking for ways to get together and interact and build problem solving skills.

- d. Bell Schedule Changes

i. This semester (See chart below) Feedback provided by board members regarding the schools 4 day a week in person schedule with Fridays online.

• Elizabeth - do we like the highschool schedule - middle school kids struggle a little bit with this, some of the classes the kids do better if they see the kids every single day. Pros and Cons to both schedules. She likes the schedule this year. Gives it a 5 out of 5 rating.

- Jodi likes the current schedule, gives it a 5. Has kids most of the time on Fridays.
- Mathew whatever teachers need is the priority. Fridays allow for kids falling behind to catch up. Kids that get bored and get ahead have more flexibility
- Kristin doesn't like it. Kids are getting 20% less instruction, majority of the students attending on Fridays are not the ones failing classes. Transmission is not happening at school and is more likely to happen out of school hours when masks and social distancing is not observed. More students are failing classes than ever before. Working parents Friday's off has been a huge burden. Less than 50% of the Friday assignments are actually being turned in.
- Suzanne really likes the current schedule, good for her children that struggle with anxiety.
- Paula For sanity sake it's been really good for teachers. Feels like she loses 20% instruction time, less than 50% of students are completing Friday assignments.
- Becky Helps identify kids falling behind and Fridays give them time to work on those missing assignments.
- Noted that close to 300 kids coming in each Friday. Overall one on one time on Fridays has been great for kids that need it.
- Moving forward TA is going to be short to 20 minutes instead of 30 all virtual intervention this semester. Doesn't feel like babysitting for teachers. Added extra minutes to every class, 2nd period extra time for announcements. A few extra minutes between lunches.
- ii. Next year
  - We don't know what the district is going to do with 4 days a week or go back to a 5 day a week schedule. Last year was a modified block schedule, M-W all 7 classes and then T-F block schedule.
- e. Rise & Aspire Plus Testing Scheduling Preferences
  - This is the only standard to see if the kids are learning. There is a need to establish a benchmark to measure for how teachers are doing in the classroom. This will enable us to show the growth year to year. 2nd week of April until the 3rd week of May. 9th Graders take aspire, 7th and 8th take Rice.
- f. After School Enrichment- programs starting second semester
  - If teachers sponsor and get enough kids the school is happy to accommodate all sorts of activities besides athletics. Email ideas to Administration. This will be opened up to the kids for feedback. Covid restrictions must be followed.
- g. School Musical: Seussical
  - Permission to do this with smaller crowds, most likely kids will have to have covid tests before performances. Coordinating how to do this safely so kids can still be involved.
- h. Technology use fee-district is looking at options
  - Idea mentioned that next year a portion of registration fee (\$10) coming back to schools to help cover technology fees, lost charger, broken fees etc.
- i. Safe Walking Routes-new homes
  - Anyone west of Mountain View Corridor are bussed next year all the kids from Bastian will not come here. Route pushes everyone to the crossing area and not at roundabouts. (see chart attached)
- j. Accreditation
  - Has been delayed because of CoronaVirus March 2-5th zoom meetings with accreditation teams. This applies to 9th graders mostly. They would like to

interview parents, those from the board will be recommended for interviews.

- k. Math progression at MCMS (See attached chart)
  - i. Incoming 7th graders can do 7th regular or 7th/8th accelerated
  - Looking at eliminating the 7th grade honors class.
  - Honrs content has been exactly the same in 7th grade, the new plan would have them take the accelerated path that doesn't skip 7th grade math any longer.

a. Registration

i. Enrollment/Permits for next year

- 14 new kids within the last week, classes are growing especially 8th grade. Concerned about the amount of permits going forward.
- Pre-registration for next year 7th and 8th grade starting to talk to kids in the classrooms, 6th grade classrooms visited today and parent night on the 27th.

#### b. Online Classes/New Online School

- New middle school and highschool strictly for online students. Classes have to be manually moved within skyward by counselors, new principal for the virtual school.
- 87 kids at MCMS that go all virtual
- This virtual school can take classes not on Utah Students connect, once they enroll in an online school that is their school for the year. Funding is based on Oct 1 enrollment.



Students walking to school should only cross South Jordan Parkway at one of three places:

- 1. Kestral Rise, with the protection of a light.
- 2. Fish Hook Rd. via the underpass.
- 3. Using the HAWK Light at Topview Rd.
- 4. Using the HAWK Light at Split Rock Dr.

For those students living South and West of Daybreak lake, they should find the safest route to Kestral Rise Rd, and travel North until they reach the school.

Those students living East of Daybreak lake, and south of South Jordan Parkway should either make their way to Kestral Rise Rd., Fish Hook Rd. or Topview Rd. to cross the South Jordan Parkway.

Those students using the Topview Rd. crossing should then use Clarks Hill Ln or Vermillion Dr. to make their way to the school.

Students living South of Daybreak Parkway should follow the various routes to Kestral Rise Rd. Please do not cross Daybreak Parkway at either of the traffic circles.
