- 1. Welcome Introductions
 - a. - 2. Approval of minutes from last meeting
 - *a.* We need to update the chair, vice-chair, and secretary and their contact information on the website
 - b. Add notes from previous meeting to the reminder email
 - c. Motioned by Jodie and seconded by Shannon, unanimously passed
- 3. School Community Council Training Report
 - a. Jodie went to the training
 - *i. it focused on the history of SCC*
 - *ii. have rules in place so that we can make sure that we have members who attend meetings and participate*
 - *iii. identify needs and write goals*
 - iv. TSSA (Teacher and Student Success Act) money
 - *v. Purpose is to establish consistent communication, have parent input, make the school great*
- 4. School Business
 - a. Budget-YTD expenditures
 - *i.* Land trust budgets
 - 1. Started with \$113,000
 - 2. Spent about \$12,000 in first quarter (professional development, academic coach, academic trackers)
 - b. NY budget survey
 - *i.* Have some community education before sending the survey on what the money can be used for
 - *ii.* Provide the categories that relate to our school goals
 - *iii.* Have a question at the end that leaves it open for parents to provide ideas that are not necessarily related to the goals but within our parameters
 - iv. This will go out before the next meeting
 - v. Do a ranked choice if we provide options

- vi. Make sure it can be done in 5-10 minutes
- vii. Teachers will also be surveyed
- c. State end of year testing
 - *i.* Companies are bidding right now and they will be doing research on the companies before the RFP is awarded
 - *ii.* We will test a couple of weeks after the testing window opens
 - *iii.* We are looking at doing block days so that the testing is not overwhelming for the students
- d. After School Enrichment
 - *i.* Dungeons and Dragons group
 - ii. Open gym
 - *iii.* Drawing group
 - iv. Chess group
- e. TSSA Money
 - *i.* Started with \$154,000 (after school enrichment, substitutes so teachers can have planning days, conference registrations, travel for conferences, supplies and materials) spent \$3000 in first quarter
- f. Block Schedule vs. traditional schedule, TA everyday vs. twice a week
 - *i.* Ask your children if they like the block schedule
 - *ii.* The block preps them for 10th grade
 - *iii.* Put this in the survey that we are sending to parents before the next meeting
 - iv. Like the 5 by 5 block schedule with more options for elective classes
 - 1. Tough for 9th graders because they have to have so many hours of seat time in order to receive credit

- 6. Counseling Update
 - a. Lunch School
 - *i.* It started out a little slow and now it has really grown, averaging 6-10 students each lunch period. A lot of math is being worked on.
 - b. Study Skills
 - *i.* 9th graders are not failing classes that they were failing before, they are keeping up with their credits for graduation
 - *ii. Grades are lower than we expected*
 - *iii.* Looking at curriculum right now
 - *iv.* Adding a social emotional component
 - c. PCCR's
 - *i.* Prepare for college and career readiness
 - *ii.* Meeting with 8th graders and their parents
 - *iii.* Goal was 20% of parent involvement and we are close to that

- *iv.* Talked about the Regent's Scholarship (this is going away and they are moving towards the Access Utah Promise Scholarship that will focus on low income families)
- d. Reality Town
 - *i.* February 20 for pre-conferences in classes and February 21 for the activity
 - *1. just for 9th grade students*
 - 2. 80 volunteers needed
 - 3. Two session of about 150 students each
