- 3. School business

a. Budget Updates: Trustlands goals and budget 2023-24 Goals:

1. Increase schoolwide proficiency rates by 2% in math, ELA and Science on standardized testing.

2. Increase percentage of "proficient" students by a minimum of 2% in all areas of RISE and Aspire tests.

3. Reduce the number of failing grades by 10% from 2022-2023Study skills have two, Purchase 50 chromebooks.TSSA budget: 89.9% remaining in the 2nd quarter.Trust Lands Budget; Total spent \$39,885.91

- b. After-school enrichment/clubs: 10 enrichment clubs available at this time. Will be posted to the school website w/ information regarding meeting times. Free membership. Must have an advisor (teacher) sponsoring team. Comes from TSSA funds.
- 4. Safe Routes Utah plan: Discussed safe walking zone. Visit Safe Routes Utah website to see walking routes: All stop signs, crosswalks are marked. No areas in daybreak qualify for crossing guards. The city pays for crossing guards. Hot crossing. No school flashing lights in our area. Flashing lights in school zones around the community will be requested for next year's plan. Working with the city to get "moose crossing" added to stop signs in the area.
- Halloween Dance (PTSA): was a success ~300-350 in attendance. 500-600 students came for treats. Discussed the option of Christmas dance on the last day of school. Option of in school vs. after.
- 6. Change in Lunches: currently have 3 lunches. 6 cashiers and all lines are open. We no longer need this many. Considering going down to 2 lunches. Feel we can get them

through the line. Thanksgiving week will trial two lunches. Split the building in east and west sections. Current schedule is taking 1.5 hours of school time and is disruptive to class rooms in session. 5th period will likely decide the lunch the students have. Expect students to eat in 10 minutes. Capacity of the lunchroom is 600 kids. Two week trial period to determine if this is feasible.

- 7. Holiday Fundraiser: Work w/ local Walmart, Christmas for Kids provides shopping gift cards for kids to purchase christmas presents. More information to follow from Jordan Ed Foundation. Raising money for homeless shelters.
