 - RISE Testing Results
 - i. Where are we compared to the district?
 - ELA: 2021 RISE = 45.9% Proficient
 - ELA: 2022 RISE = 50.8% Proficient
 - ELA: 2023 RISE 52.9% Proficient (District is 40.7% Proficient) Increase of 2.1% from last year.

- Math: 2021 RISE 44.6
- Math: 2022 RISE = 55.2%
- Math: 2023 RISE = 61.6% (District is 39.9% Proficient) Increase = 6.4% from 2023
- Science: 2021 RISE 54.5
- Science: 2022 RISE = 57.7%
- Science: 2023 RISE = 57.2% (District is 45.5% Proficient) Decrease of 0.5%, but 2nd in Growth
- ii. Did we meet our goals?
 - 7th grade Science, no. All other subjects we met our goal of 2% increase across the board.

- 10. Counseling Update
 - Credit recovery is going well. # of F's recovered is up from 36% in 2021-22 to 66% in 2023-23. The goal is to have no students deficient as they leave MCMS.
 - Study Skills: 76 students enrolled and no students were failing at midterm.
 - Sense of Belonging at MCMS increased 5% from 50% in spring 2022 to 55% in Spring 2023. This is 10% higher than the district and in the 80th percentile, nationally.
 - 67% of students responded that they are able to regulate their emotions, up 6% from Spring 2022, 8% higher than the district and in the 99th percentile, nationally.
